UNITED KINGDOM – Published on 31st May 2024, just ahead of the 80th anniversary of the D-Day Landings (6th June 2024), the writing of *Tamarisk* has been a labour of love for best-selling author and lover of all things French, Angela Locke.

Having taken 43 years to research her subject forensically, this fictional novel, based on factual stories, is underpinned by its protagonist Pierre's determination to survive, and his own efforts and those of others to heal and restore the vestiges of what has been left behind after the devastation of war.
